<u>Blackstairs Farming Group Notes</u>: Thank you to all who came to the information meeting on the 9th October in Rathanna about the potential under the RDP 2014-2020 for a locally led agri-environment project in Mount Leinster & the Blackstairs. There was a great turnout of circa 70 people. Thank you also to Colin Gallagher of the European Forum on Nature Conservation and Pastoralism (EFNCP); ecologist Dr Mary Tubridy; Dr James Moran of IT Sligo who spoke at the event and Minister of State Ann Phelan TD who opened the meeting.

Colin Gallagher presented his research into changes to farming in The Blackstairs gathered from farmer interviews and questionnaires. His analysis of census data confirmed a 50% fall in the number of farmers under the age of 44 in the electoral areas surrounding The Blackstairs between 1991 and 2010. Following a discussion it was decided to proceed to the next stage of the project and 12 farmers from around the mountain were nominated to the Blackstairs Farming Group committee to help with this.

Since the Rathanna meeting the Blackstairs Farming Group have attended a Department of Agriculture seminar on the locally-led RDP measure held in Portlaoise on Friday 16th October and a small group are to also attend the EFNCP conference in Corofin, Co Clare on the 23rd and 24th October. Following these events a meeting of the new committee will be held in early November.
